Main responsibilities

Under the supervision of the Head of Delegation, the Political Adviser researches, analyses and advises the ICRC delegation on political developments and changes in the overall environment and conflict and security dynamics. S/he identifies, maintains and broadens a network of contacts at the national level and facilitates the management's access to them. S/he initiates, formulates, and implements strategies to address identified issues and delegation objectives in the legal and political domain.
